IN THE MATTER of JEAN ALISON CARR, Spinster

I, WILLIAM GEORGE MacDONALD of 31 Queen Anne Street,
St. Marylebone in the County of London M.B., Ch.B. Aberd. 1908
make oath and say as follows:-

1. Because of my experience in the treatment by means of the Ischlonsky Embryonic Hormone of the physical or endocrinic basis of mental infirmity I was called upon to undertake the treatment of the above named Patient.
2. I am informed and believe that the above named Jean Alison Carr was formerly in the care of Dr. Herbert Challice Crouch at St. Michaels Ascot in the County of Berks that she left there in or about October 1934 and that since that time she has resided with her Mother at Ober House Brockenhurst and in London and recently with a Nurse Companion at Romany Cottage Fairwarp Uckfield Sussex.
3. The said Jean Alison Carr has from the 5th day of November 1935 been under my care for treatment since which time her conduct and discourse have gradually improved and now are calm coherent and rational.
4. Except for the fact she does not deal with her financial affairs she is now leading the life of a normal person subject to the disabilities caused by her physical condition.
5. I have perused a copy of the Affidavit of the said Herbert Challice Crouch sworn by him on the 28th day of June 1934 and I myself noticed the symptoms from which the said

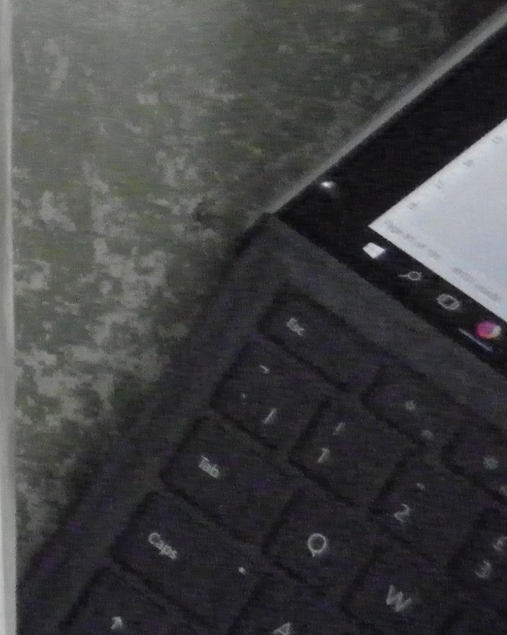
